

A MESSAGE FROM JAMIE



In the winter of 2017, Othello had the idea to create I, Too, Sing America: a production of poems by authors of color set to original music. With a small budget and a vague idea, we thought maybe we could get a couple of singers and dancers to create a simple cabaret revue. The following summer, after a scrappy audition process that included recruiting performers after their shows, enlisting co-workers, friends, and friends of friends, and enthusiastic phone calls after jaw-dropping video submissions, we looked around at the thirty incredible talents in the room and thought: "We have a real show on our hands." Our ambition commensurately grew. The summer of 2018, that cast and creative team from the first I, Too, Sing America production established a spirit of collaboration, vulnerability, team unity, and exuberant joy that I had not anticipated. During rehearsals, the cast would gather to watch their castmates, hooting and hollering in support and awe of each other's performances. There was a real love in that theater and that love had legs! Cast members went on to be in long lasting romantic relationships, others shared housing, and many have created friendships and artistic collaborations that expanded beyond the rehearsal room. Since its inception, over seventy different artists have worked on I, Too, Sing America.

For this production, our third full mount, we are so excited to welcome back original and returning cast members and welcome new cast members, some I have known since childhood and some we found from watching their videos on Instagram. While this rehearsal process was unconventional with roughly half the cast in quarantine and Zooming in our first week, somehow there was still the familiar impulse to groove to Othello's music from Zoom boxes and share jokes with the rehearsal room from the chat.

In the four-plus years we have worked on this, Othello, Chung, and I continue to be surprised and excited by the way the production can grow and change. We are so grateful for this artistic community and for all the stages where we have been able to share the production. Some iteration of this show has been performed at the Buriel Clay Theater in the Fillmore, at the Cherry Blossom Festival in Japantown, at the Juneteenth Celebration at the Bayview Opera House, for the 2019 TBA Awards, at California State University, in East Bay musical theatre classes, over Zoom, in the Skyline Recording Studio, and at SFBATCO's home, the Brava Theater in the Mission.






