CARLOS BARÓN PLAYWRIGHT

He worked at San Francisco State University from 1978 until 2016 and is now an emeritus professor in theatre arts. Carlos has acted with Berkeley Repertory Theatre, San Jose Repertory Theatre, Thick Description, San Jose Stage Company, One Act Theatre Company, and The Eureka Theatre. He founded Teatro Latino of San Francisco (1977 to 1984) and the Rainbow Theater Company (1990 to 2015). For Teatro Latino, Carlos wrote Pasión y Prisión de Lolita Lebrón (1978-79), Liz Estrada (1982), The Truly Needy Traveling Show (1983), and Barriovisions (1984). In 2006, he wrote Poeta Pan about the Chilean poet Pablo Neruda for Rainbow Theatre, which toured to Chile twice. Carlos wrote La Posarela in 2008, for the Community Music Center. He played El Diablote in the production for eight years. He worked as a writer and performer in Son de la Misión with his friend John Calloway in 2016 and is currently a columnist for El Tecolote ("The Devil's Advocate").
