

PERFORMER BIOS




Rodney Earl Jackson Jr. (he/him), a co-Founder and co-Artistic Director of SFBATCO, made his Broadway debut in *The Book of Mormon* and was last seen at American Conservatory Theatre in the West Coast premiere of *Toni Stone*. He traveled North America in the first national tour of *Motown: The Musical*. Rodney is a San Francisco native who built his love for theatre in public city organizations such as SFArtsEd, San Francisco Recreation and Park's Young People's Teen Musical Theater Company, and the Ruth Asawa San Francisco School of the Arts, where he graduated from the Theatre Department. Other theatre credits: Berkeley Repertory Theatre: *Ain't Too Proud: the life and times of the Temptations;* SFBATCO: *I, Too, Sing America*.



Marcelo Javier (he/him) is a co-Founder and co-Artistic Director of SFBATCO. Acting credits include Riff in West Side Story; I, Too, Sing America; Not Another Holiday Show!; Home for "all of" the Holidays (SFBATCO); Skippyjon Jones (Theatreworks USA); Rent (Syracuse Stage); A Midsummer Night's Dream (Bathwater Productions). Alex Akin (**she/her**) is a singer and actress born and raised in San Francisco. She graduated with a BFA in Musical Theatre from the University of Michigan. After graduating, she moved to New York City where she spent the next 5 years performing in various concerts, workshops, festivals and shows. She is now back in San Francisco teaching and working in schools and seeing where life takes her!



Angela Travino (**she/her**) was raised in San Francisco, but has called NYC her home for 8+ years. Angela's theater credits include the 2nd National Tour of South Pacific, Tim Rice's From Here to Eternity, Anne of Green Gables at The REV Theatre Company, and Beehive - also at The Rev, to name a few. Before the Covid shutdown, Angela was slated to play "Big Alison" in Theatre Raleigh's 2020 production of Fun Home, which is now scheduled for summer 2021. Upon graduation from Syracuse University, Angela and her fellow alumnifounded the premiere a cappella group RANGE a cappella. RANGE has performed on the Oscars, opened for Kelly Clarkson at Radio City Music Hall, and has collaborated with Billboard, Sesame Street, and Nickelodeon. 




